### Benson Rotary's Early Years

Last week we concluded the year 1956, and coverage of District Governor Bryant Whiting's letter to our club for July of that year. This week we will harvest the historical interest from his August letter. As I mentioned last week, DG Bryant's letters are most interesting. Rotary would have been well served had every DG documented their tenure in such a fashion.

In August of 1956, DG Bryant was still new in his role, and his enthusiasm shows. He was traveling from town to town through the district, meeting new Rotarians and carrying the message of International President, Paul Lang. Bryant was already soliciting names from each club for the next year's DG. Ballots were being scheduled to go out in November.

The previous DG, Mr. John English, had been assigned to District 166 as Rotary Information Counselor. He was to meet at the old Westward Ho Hotel in Phoenix with all district Presidents and Secretaries, along with the DG, to discuss issues related to classification, information officers, and Rotaralia in general. A stag party was scheduled for that evening, so this was to be a big day for Rotarians. I am not sure what was meant by a stag party at that time, but I am sure that it was harmless. Bryant spoke highly of John, urging all to attend.

Since the month was August, many members were on vacation with their families. DG Bryant encouraged all members to use the International Directory to locate Rotary Clubs for make ups. At that time the directory cost 50 cents. As always, attendance was very important to Rotary. Bryant's visit to our Club was scheduled for 25 September and the Board was getting ready to meet in anticipation. Monthly reports from individual clubs were due on the 10th of each month. Several had been late so Bryant was ready to institute a policy of calling collect to retrieve the information.

### Last Week's Program

Marty Riley, for Operation Christmas Child, was once again with us, complete with shoe boxes to pass out. As she explained, the rural town usually do not have a shoe store so she provides them. Again we saw a brief film about the program and the children in impoverished areas that receive the boxes filled with goodies.

She suggested for the boxes - especially hygiene e.g. soap (put in baggie), comb, toothbrush and paste. They would love to have some clothing - T-shirt, shoes. And, of course, toys - crayon and paper, slinky, school supplies. All would love some hard candy. More suggestions are included in the folder that comes in the box.

The boxes are due by November 15. They can be turned in to Rosemarie.
